The choice of means and methods in urban warfare

Ambassador Dr. Thomas Hajnoczi is Director for Disarmament, Arms Control and Non-Proliferation in the Austrian Federal Ministry for European and International Affairs. Prior to taking up this position he was Permanent Representative to the United Nations Office at Geneva and before as Permanent Representative to the Council of Europe in Strasbourg. Deputy Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York, Director for Security Policy in the Ministry and in several other posts. He has worked extensively on human disarmament issues such as the Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Treaty, the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Arms and lately on bringing about a Political Declaration on EWIPA.



Colonel Warren L. Wells serves as the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) for the United States Army's XVIII Airborne Corps and the Fort Bragg, North Carolina, military installation. His prior assignments include time at the Pentagon, assignments as both a military prosecutor and defense counsel, as the SJA at 1st Infantry Division and Fort Riley, and the Deputy SJA at 1st Armored Division in Wiesbaden, Germany. COL Wells deployed to Bosnia in 1997-98 in support of Operation Joint Guard and has deployed to Iraq four times, including two deployments in support of Operation Inherent Resolve, the international coalition pledged to defeat ISIS. COL Wells is a graduate of the University of Mississippi and received a Juris Doctorate from Brigham Young University. He holds a Master of Laws from The Judge Advocate General's School and a Master of Strategic Studies from the US Army War College.



Dr Eirini Giorgou is a legal adviser in the Arms & Conduct of Hostilities Unit of the ICRC, based in Geneva. Prior to joining the Legal Division, Eirini worked in the ICRC's unit for relations with armed and security forces. Outside of the ICRC, she has several years' experience in multilateral disarmament and arms control diplomacy and negotiations on both conventional and nuclear weapons. Eirini is a licensed lawyer and holds a PhD in international law from the University of Geneva, Switzerland.



First Class Chief Commissioner **Colonel Rudolph Stamminger** joined the Air Force in 1996. Legal advisor and specialist in armed conflict law, he has participated in numerous foreign operations (mainly in the former Yugoslavia and Africa). He was assigned as operational legal advisor for the NATO Joint Forces Command General Staff in Naples and as operational advisor for NATO Allied Transformation Command (ACT) in the United States. He was also a legal advisor to the Air Defence and Air Operations Command (CDAOA) in Paris and was the director of the advanced course in the law of armed conflict at the International Institute of Humanitarian Law in Sanremo and teaches this subject at the University of Paris-Nanterre. Since last summer, he has been the Head of the International Humanitarian Law office of French Ministry of the Armed Force.
