

## GENERAL PROFILE OF THE COURSES

The course on the Law on Internal Displacement is organized annually by the International Institute for Humanitarian Law in cooperation with the Special Rapporteur on the Human Rights of Internally Displaced Persons. This year the course will be a special edition to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Guiding Principles on Internal Displacement (GP20).

The course is designed for government officials and civil society representatives responsible for and dealing with internal displacement issues. The course last five days and is conducted in English. This course responds to the increasing demand for up-to-date information on and understanding of internal displacement and the applicable law. Participants will strengthen their skills and knowledge through tailored exercises and case studies, and will have the opportunity to interact with the Special Rapporteur as well as with practitioners and experts in the field of internal displacement.

The course objectives, in line with GP20 strategy for advancing protection, prevention and solutions for Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), are:

- enhancing the participants' understanding of the international norms underpinning the protection of internally displaced persons;
- promoting the use and implementation of the Guiding Principles of Internal Displacement;
- building up capacities of governments to establish or improve existing legislation and policies on the protection of internally displaced persons; and,
- encouraging the sharing of experiences and best practices among the participants regarding protection of IDPs and the search for solutions.
