



## IIHL Military Course Dress Code

The military department seeks to provide a professional educational environment that encourages the exchange of ideas between participants from different cultures, walks of life, and of differing rank and experience. In support of this learning model, participants should wear civilian business casual attire to all IIHL military courses and functions.

The IIHL offers the following dress code guidance for military courses at the institute, but recognizes that there are cultural differences in what clothing constitutes 'business casual' attire. Irrespective of this guidance, participants should dress appropriately according to their own customs.

***For Men:*** Business casual always includes a collared shirt. Button down and polo-styled shirts are appropriate. Jackets and ties are optional, but may be worn to suit individual comfort and style. Shoes should be closed-toe. Flip flops, shorts, beach wear, and tee shirts are not appropriate. Denim may be worn, if of the type intended for business wear (no tears, tatters, and of appropriate fit).

***For Women:*** Colored shirts or twin sets are appropriate. Skirts or slacks with sweater sets or blouses that have sleeves. Sleeveless tops may be worn, if professional in appearance. Shoes should have a generally professional appearance. Flip flops, shorts, beach wear, and tee shirts are not appropriate. Denim may be worn, if of the type intended for business wear (no tears, tatters, and of appropriate fit).
