GENERAL COURSE AIMS & OBJECTIVES

A newer course built on previous IIHL Workshops, which examines the major elements and issues concerning detention & CPERS in a wide range of operational contexts.

Through our 45 years of experience in providing training to the military, the course has been designed by those who have current & actual operational experience of the issues examined.

The course is designed for military officers and civil servants involved with the planning, conduct, and oversight of operations that may involve detention & CPERS issues. It is suitable for both Legal Advisors (LEGADS) and other staff officers throughout the Chain of Command and is tri-service in nature.

The course is designed to equip those involved in operations with a clear understanding of:

- The legal basis for detention & CPERS status in IAC & NIAC.
- The planning and conduct of detention.
- Intelligence Exploitation.
- Detention Oversight.
- Detention in specific types of operations.

Training is conducted by means of central presentations, question and answer sessions, small group exercises, and case studies. As a result, the subject matter is considered from both a theoretical and practical perspective and is very interactive.

The Faculty Staff are leading practitioners drawn from both the military and civilian environments, encompassing a substantial range of experience and perspectives.

The course is taught in English at an unclassified level and under Chatham House Rules.

ADMINISTRATION

The registration fee is €1.100. This should be remitted before the start of the course, or on arrival, in cash or Euro currency cheque. Credit cards are accepted.
